

Hampshire Record Office Display

As we reported in the last newsletter, and described in detail in the Editorial (*page 3*), we have now set up the HMG display at the Hampshire Record Office (HRO), which you see in the pictures. To remind you, it will be finishing on Thursday 29 February, and after that we are hoping to display all or part of it in other places. We have already had one request from Eling Tide Mill.



The display occupies 6 panels; the first two are shown on the front cover, while here are the rest of them, and a display cabinet with examples of HMG publications. These boards belong to HRO, so when we take the display to other places (as we have been asked to do), we will have to adapt it as necessary. Although HMG has its own display boards, they may be too small.
