More information about both these events will be available soon.



## **Database of Millers**

#### Mary Yoward's Database of Millers

It was some time ago that Mary started the millers and millwrights database. We thought it would be helpful in tracing families of millers - we didn't realise the size of the task at that time! I listed millers at Record Offices when Mary was doing our family history.

We later discovered a lady called Eve Logan had been doing a similar thing for the north and eastern parts. Unfortunately, she contracted cancer, but before she died we had promised to take her work and incorporate it into our database. 48 A4 ring binders arrived, all hand written, but with the aid of members of the Hampshire Mills Group, they are gradually being added.

The Mills Archive has been given our database and it has proved very popular with family historians, receiving many 'hits' each day.

The data base was all Mary's work but now I want to carry it on, as I am sure she would have wanted me to do. Jim Knight has recently continued entering Eve Logan's written entries into the computer and people are still sending me lists of millers.

The entries now total over 30,000 and when you consider it takes at least one and a half minutes to enter, miller, sex, date, place, county, notes and source for each one, you will realise the momentous task that Mary took on.

It will continue to grow, and if you come across any millers or millwrights, please let us enter them into Mary's database.
